

The Melville Press is a private press dedicated to producing fine illustrated limited editions, born from a passion for Melville's work, capturing the spirit of voyaging and the sea.



The books of The Melville Press have been represented by fine booksellers and collected by prestigious institutions nationally and internationally. The editions have been acquired by The British Library, The Library of Congress, The Newberry Library, The New York Public Library, The National Libraries of Australia, New Zealand and Scotland, The Museum of the Book in the Netherlands and by The National Museum of Women in the Arts, among many others.

In the Direction of the Beginning | Dylan Thomas

Book Design & Block Prints by Catherine Kanner Printed & Bound by Foolscap Press

Originally published in the A Prospect of the Sea in 1939, In the Direction of the Beginning is a powerful prose poem of love and the sea.

Kanner designed the edition on a generous scale, with a self-closing, three-panel folio cover of black Japanese silk. The book title is stamped in silver foil on the spine. The cover is secured by a shell pin, and includes a tipped-in print of flames on the sea. The pin was designed by the artist and manufactured in Asia.

For this edition, Kanner created nine new images, printed letterpress by Lawrence Van Velzer of Foolscap Press from her original woodcuts. The text, which holds to a central point on each the page suggests the ocean's horizon. The typeface is Centaur, a refined font with enough substance to hold up to the bold black and white prints. The paper is Pescia 100% cotton mould-made, dampened before printing to aid in accepting the large inked areas of the images. The book was bound by Peggy Gottheld of Foolscap Press, hand-sewn to allow the prints to cross the central gutter of the book without interruption.

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Prayers Written at Vailima | Robert Louis Stevenson

Book Design & Block Prints by Catherine Kanner
Printed by Windowpane Press | Bound by Allwyn O'Mara

Prayers Written at Vailima reflects the beauty and simplicity of R.L. Stevenson's prayers. The book originated with Kanner's linoleum cut images for Mrs. R.L. Stevenson's Introduction. The images and text carry the reader to the island of Vailima, up to the Stevenson home where prayers were read by the family and their Samoan neighbors. Each prayer is accompanied by an image reflecting Stevenson's deep appreciation of his island home.

Kanner has created 23 images printed letterpress by Bonnie Thompson Norman of Windowpane Press from the original linoleum blocks. Hiromi Sansui rice paper was selected for its lightness and softness, as a prayer offered up to heaven. The book cover is brick-red silk, blind-stamped with a double orchid, and includes Thai red mango-leaf endpapers. Bound by Allwyn O'Mara, the pages are french-folded with interleaving paper. The signatures are sewn with a 13th century technique which allows the pages to fall open completely. The edition includes a rice paper dust jacket printed with the double orichid mirroring the blind-stamped double orchid beneath.

The design of this first edition published by The Melville Press evolved from Kanner's portraits of characters from Melville's **Moby Dick**. The design reflects the sober and beautiful tone of the novel, and is dedicated to Herman Melville and his masterpiece.

Kanner designed the book to be viewed conventionally, but the unique accordion binding allows the book to be opened fully. When opened, the portraits of the Pequod's crew may be displayed as a gallery. Allwyn O'Mara has secured the accordian with a harpoon-shaped anchor behind the front cover page. O'Mara chose to glue rather than fold the paper to give a sail-like appearance. John Robinson of The Tortoise Press' evenness and clarity of the printing is outstanding. End papers were hand-painted by Kanner. Each end paper is unique.

The constellation Cetus is silver-foil stamped on the cover and appears throughout the text. Each of the 11 stars represents a character from the book. The curved line represents the arch of the earth's horizon.
